Member Case Study: City of Toronto, Solid Waste Management

CHT facilitated a design workshop with the Solid Waste team to better understand residents' behaviours regarding Blue Bin recycling contamination and to improve future programming. Building on the learnings they gained from CHT's **half-day training workshops** in **Design & Agile for Public Good**, staff felt better equipped to engage in constructive conversations with residents. The successful event was profiled by the <u>Toronto Star</u>.

By engaging a dozen residents from a range of backgrounds and tech abilities to test the app, the StreetART tech development team received valuable feedback which helped to make it more accessible and user-friendly.
